March Monthly Meeting

Retired Marine Speaker Gunther Graybar Tells Us The Facts Concerning The Riverside National Cemetery



Our speaker for the March meeting was retired Sgt Major Gunther Graybar who is extremely active in affairs at the Riverside National Cemetery. This magnificent facility that honors our military members who have gone west as well as members of their immediate families. Although many of us have flown over the facility to honor fallen friends with the Missing Man Formation, there is much more to know of this elegant place.

The RNC was opened on November 11, 1978. It is one of three cemeteries that is controlled by the Veterans Administration. There are currently 922 acres of current burials. There are committees that run the facility and have fund raising operations to keep it in good condition as well as to improve the facility. For instance, there has just been \$15,000 spent to provide new benches for visitors to the graveyard. The crown jewels of the site are the Medal Of Honor and MIA memorial features, a pairing that does not exist anywhere else. There are three Medal Of Honor winners buried at RNC currently and five more that are committed to rest there when their time comes. These facilities were built in the 1990's at great expense.

The Medal Of Honor Memorial was built at a cost of \$2.1 million while the MIA/POW facility was constructed at a cost of \$775,000. There is also a current effort to construct a Viet Nam Wall. Gunther has raised \$480,000 for this effort.

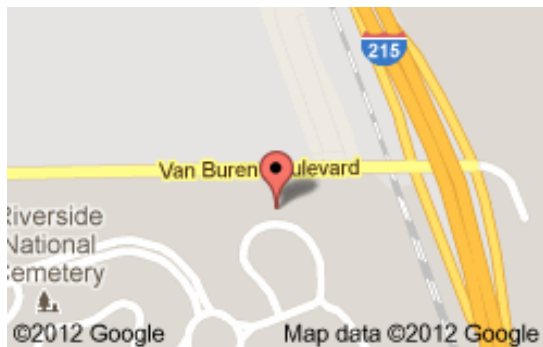
Gunther's history includes being born in Germany and coming to the United States in 1949 with his father after the close of WW II. After 26 years in the Marine corps, he retired and has been working to benefit the RNC since that time.

The availability of the cemetery to those of us who have served in the military was presented. All veterans are eligible as well as their wives. Their children are also eligible if under 21 at the time of death or under 23 if in college. Any child who has had a serious condition re-

quiring medical care since birth is also eligible at any age. Arrangements may be made through any mortuary, although commitments in advance can be made. There are facilities for cremation urns as well as burial, although the urn must be a special size to comply with the requirements at Riverside National. There is an average of 37 people buried per day at the facility, thus scheduling can be a problem.

The facility is governed by an 18 member board with the current leader being quite helpful and cooperative. The Cemetery raises funds in part from the sale of plaques created by or very own Bud "Pipes" Ukes. Gunther also mentioned that there is a free concert by the Riverside Orchestra that is most enjoyable and quite popular every Fourth Of July.
